motion from the Finance Committee was presented to the church during a business meeting at the end of morning worship service on Jan. 19, 2025. motion concerns a request from Pastor Earl Spivey, Discipleship Coordinator, to fund 3 areas of Discipleship and Ministry at TCBC. The first proposal was asking for \$1500 for the Disciplehip Ministry of the church. These funds are currently available in the budget and ready for use. The second proposal asked for \$2500 to fund a new College and Careers Ministry of church. This ministry would have a strong focus on TCBC making coordinated efforts to stay in contact and minister to college age students and early career graduates. The third proposal asked for \$2000 to fund meetings/ meals with Prospective Members and their families. These meetings will allow for Pastor Earl to explain the membership process and answer questions while showing hospitality and sincerity in helping them.

The motion is to move \$4500 from the Mission Endowment funds invested at the NC Baptist Foundation to be used to fund these proposals as presented to the church. The Finance Committee has unanimously approved the funding of Proposal 2 & 3 using these funds. We need church approval to move the funds. A business meeting will be held on Feb. 2, 2025 to vote on this motion from the Finance Committee.
